1. Policy Statement

Gwneud Make Do is committed to ensuring that cost is not a barrier to participation. We recognise that some individuals may not be able to afford course fees, and we aim to make our activities accessible to as many people as possible.

To support this, Gwneud Make Do offers a number of subsidised or free places on courses. Our approach is open and flexible, and not based on means testing.

2. Principles

Subsidised places are available to anyone who feels that cost may prevent them from taking part.

Decisions are based on enquiries from potential participants, rather than financial assessments.

The process is confidential, respectful, and non-judgemental.

Gwneud Make Do will balance fairness with sustainability, ensuring subsidies are available across our programme.

We may prioritise first-time participants, underrepresented groups, or those who would particularly benefit, depending on course demand.

3. How to Apply

Potential participants can enquire about subsidised places by contacting Gwneud Make Do directly (in person, by email or through our website).

No financial evidence or formal application process is required.

A member of staff will discuss availability and confirm whether a subsidised place can be offered.

4. Allocation of Subsidised Places

The number of free or subsidised places will depend on available funding and capacity for each course.

Places will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis where demand exceeds availability.

Gwneud Make Do reserves the right to limit the number of subsidised places per individual to ensure fair access for all.

5. Monitoring and Review

Uptake of subsidised places will be monitored to ensure fair distribution and inform future planning. This policy will be reviewed annually, or sooner if funding arrangements or demand change.
